The severity of intimate partner violence is often greater in cases where the pattern of abuse was established in adolescence !

50% of youth who have been victims of both dating violence and rape attempt suicide!

58% of college students say they don't know how to help someone who's experiencing dating abuse!

Only 33% of teens who were in an abusive relationship ever told anyone about the abuse!

57% of college students say dating abuse is difficult to identify!
